



Use this lesson review to celebrate Friendship Day (Aug. 4, 2002) or use with any lesson focusing on friendship, kindness or sharing.

Directions: Cut two 1" hearts per child. Number each heart so that you have two identical sets. Place one set of hearts in a paper bag marked Friendship Quiz. Put the other set in an empty box or other container.

To play: Each child chooses a number from the paper bag when he arrives and keeps it throughout club. After the lesson

ask the first review question. The child who answers correctly gets a small piece of candy and draws a heart from the box. The "friend" holding a heart with the same number also receives a candy.

Variation: Draw numbers from the box throughout club to select children to hold the song, etc. Or use the numbered hearts to award team points. When a child gives a correct response his team receives the amount of points on his heart. He receives bonus points by drawing a heart from the box.
