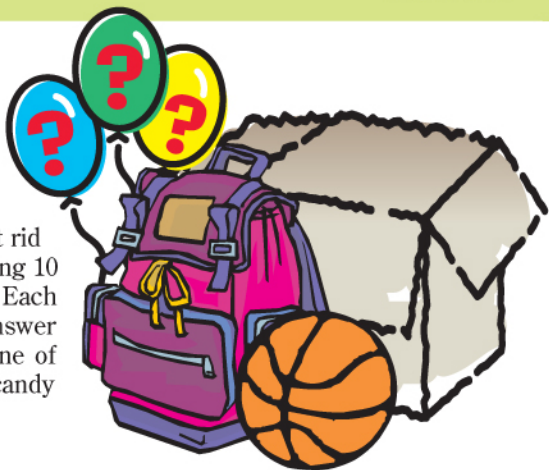




1. Borrow a child's backpack and fill it with 10 small balloons, each with a question mark drawn on it with a wide marker and a piece of wrapped candy inside. Challenge the children to get rid of all the balloons by answering 10 review questions correctly. Each child who gives a right answer may use a pencil to break one of the balloons and enjoy the candy reward.



2. Set a deep carton on a chair in front of the room. Place a crumpled paper or another cushioning item in the bottom of the box. Let each child who answers a question correctly try to get a basketball into the box at a distance of 10 to 15 feet. Each one who makes a "basket" receives a novelty eraser.
3. Make 10 apples from red and green felt. Glue a green paper worm on back of 3 apples. Place apples randomly on flannelboard. Divide class into two teams. Ask review questions, alternating teams. If a correct answer is given the child turns over an apple. He gets 50 points if the apple is good (no worm), but loses 50 points if there is a worm. Applaud the winning team and give a gummy worm to everyone in the class when the review is over. *Alternative:* Make apples from red and green art paper and have children pull them from a paper bag.
