<p>4's use about 1500 words. Often ask what? Begin to use plurals.</p> <p>5's use about 2100 words. Speaks in complete sentences.</p> <p>Ask who and why? Begin to use "because", "their", & "myself".</p> <p>Learning to make use of these expressions: Thank-you, I'm sorry, Please, I love you.</p> <p>Asks details. Want to know what words mean and how things work. Sometimes he is asking, not because he wants the knowledge but to practice talking skills.</p> <p>Only large muscles are coordinated; finger muscles</p>	<p>4's have attention span of 10 minutes.</p> <p>5's about 15 mins.</p> <p>Cannot understand symbolism. Thinks concretely. Use phrases and words that mean exactly what they say.</p> <p>Understand idea of time: past, present and future verbs i.e., now, later. Able to tell about a recent experience. Loves to recount events.</p> <p>While little children need to take home their handwork every day, sheets can now be collected in a binder and taken home when series is over. A review book can be given at the end of the semester.</p>	<p>Looks forward to new experiences in learning. Admits when needs help.</p> <p>Fantasy is at its height. Has a great imagination. Tries to sort out real from what is pretend, but has difficulty. Believes everything you say.</p> <p>Sensitive and observant. Affectionate and wants to be loved. Aware of what people think and say about him. Fears people laughing at him.</p> <p>Learns to develop attitudes concerning right and wrong. Usually makes no allowances for good intentions. See right and wrong as black and white.</p> <p>No</p>	<p>Their world widens slightly. Senses himself one among many. Are becoming group conscious and likes inter-active play. Reasoning is based entirely on how things appear to him. His powers of observation are not entirely accurate.</p> <p>Strong sense of family and home. Tells family faults outside of home without restraint.</p> <p>Loves dramatic play usually assuming the role of a parent. Great imitators. Understands a simple story. Can carry plot.</p> <p>Repeats long sentences accurately. Can remember short memory verses.</p>	<p>understanding of cause and effect. Unable to consider the motivation behind an action.</p> <p>Enjoys obedience and thrives on praise. Exaggerates, boasts and praises self. Bosses, tattles and criticizes others. Yet, excuses own behavior.</p>	<p>Leadership is beginning to show. Tends to be bossy. Likes to invite friends to Bible classes.</p> <p>Still basically self-centered. Can learn to share with one or two others and respect their needs. Learning to understand fairness.
